DEAR JENSEN CUSTOMER

Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. This manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing. Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

To establish a safe level:

- Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.
- Once you have established a comfortable sound level. Set the dial and leave it there.

Take a minute to do this now will help to prevent hearing damage or loss in the future. After all, we want you listening for a lifetime.






GETTING STARTED

POWER SOURCE

This unit operates on 2 'AAA' (UM-4) batteries (not included).


INSTALLING BATTERIES

- 1. Remove the BELT CLIP (#11).
- **2.** Remove the BATTERY DOOR (#12).
- 3. Follow the polarity diagram (+ and -) shown in the battery compartment, and insert 2 'AAA' (UM-4) batteries (not included).
- **4.** Reattach the BATTERY DOOR (#12) and lock it in place.



Notes:

- Replace the batteries when the LOW BATTERY INDICATOR (#16) shows on the LCD display.
- Turn off the unit before changing the batteries.
- When changing batteries, the unit will retain the time and your station presets for 30 seconds. Change the batteries within this 30 second time frame or you will need to reset the time and all your saved station presets.
- For better performance and longer operating time, we recommend using alkaline batteries.



BATTERY WARNINGS

- 1. Be sure that the batteries are installed correctly. Wrong polarity may damage the unit.
- 2. (a) Do not mix old and new batteries.
 - (b) Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- 3. If the unit is not to be used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries. Old or leaking batteries can cause damage to the unit and may void the warranty.
- 4. Do not dispose of batteries in fire, batteries may explode or leak.
- 5. Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions).
- 6. Dispose the old batteries in accordance with the local regulation.

BELT CLIP

The unit includes a BELT CLIP that allows you to wear the SAB-60 on your belt or attach it to your bag.

1. Attaching the BELT CLIP

- a) Slide the two side tabs on the BELT CLIP into the two mounting tracks located on the back of the unit.
- b) The BELT CLIP locking tab will snap into place once it's properly attached.



2. Removing the BELT CLIP


- a) Pull back on the locking tab located on the BELT CLIP.
- b) At the same time, slide the BELT CLIP down to remove it from the two mounting tracks.



ARMBAND

An ARMBAND is included that allows you to wear the SAB-60 on your arm while walking, working out or working around the house.

- a) Feed the end of the ARMBAND through the openings in the BELT CLIP as shown below.
- b) Attach the BELT CLIP to the SAB-60.
- c) Place the ARMBAND around your arm and adjust it using the hook and loop strips that are attached to the ARMBAND.



IMPORTANT NOTE: After adjusting the ARMBAND to your arm, make sure it's a comfortable fit and not too tight. If the ARMBAND is too tight, it could cut off or limit circulation during physical activity.

SETTING THE CLOCK TIME

Note: The unit will be in standby mode when you install batteries for the first time. The display will begin flashing and continue flashing until the time is set.

- 1. Make sure the unit is off and in standby mode with the time showing on the display.
- 2. If the unit is on (radio playing in earbuds), press and hold the BAND / POWER **O** BUTTON (#5) for a few seconds to turn the unit off and place it in standby mode.
- 3. Press and hold TIME / MEM BUTTON (#2), the hour digits on the display will flash
- 4. Within seven seconds, press the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4) repeatedly until the correct hour is reached.
- 5. Press the TIME / MEM BUTTON (#2) again and the minute digits on the display will flash.
- 6. Within seven seconds, press the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4) repeatedly until the correct minute is reached.
- 7. Press the TIME / MEM BUTTON (#2) to confirm the time.

Note:

Make sure the hour is set so that AM or PM is correctly displayed. If the PM INDICATOR (#21) is showing on the display, the displayed time is "PM". If the AM INDICATOR (#13) is showing on the display, the time displayed is "AM".

RADIO OPERATION

NOTE: The FM tuner in this unit uses the cord from the earbuds as the antenna, so it's important that the earbuds are plugged in and the cord is fully unwrapped and extended for best reception.

- 1. Insert the earbuds into the EARPHONE JACK (#1) and press and hold the BAND / POWER BUTTON (#5) to turn on the radio.
- 2. Tap the BAND / POWER **O** BUTTON (#5) repeatedly to select AM or FM.
- 3. Press and hold the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4) to search previous / next available station. If the reception is poor, try Manual Tuning to fine-tune the station. Tap the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4) briefly to manually tune through the frequency band.
- 4. Adjust the VOLUME + BUTTON (#9) / VOLUME BUTTON (#10) to obtain the desired sound level.
- 5. Press the BASS BUTTON (#8) to enhance the bass effect of the music being played. Press the BASS BUTTON (#8) again to turn the effect off.
- 6. Press and hold the BAND / POWER **O** BUTTON (#5) to turn off the unit when finish listening. The unit will display the time.

Notes:

- When in radio mode, the display will automatically switch back to show the time after a few seconds.
- When listening to the radio, you can check the frequency of the station you are listening by tapping the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4) once. The unit will automatically switch back to show the time after a few seconds.

TIPS FOR BEST RECEPTION

- FM The FM radio uses the cord from the earbuds as the antenna. Unwrap and extend the cord for best reception. The FM STEREO INDICATOR (#15) will show on the display when receiving a stereo broadcast and signal is strong enough.
- AM The AM antenna is located inside the cabinet of the unit. If AM reception is weak, change the position of the unit until the internal antenna picks up the strongest signal.

Setting the Radio Station presets

The unit allows you to store up to 10 FM stations and 10 AM stations for easy recall at any time.

- 1. In the FM or AM mode, tune to the radio station you want to store in memory by using the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4).
- 2. Tap the STORE / ALARM BUTTON (#6). The MEMORY INDICATOR (#17) will turn on and the PRESET CHANNEL NUMBER (#18) will flash on the LCD display.
- 3. To change the preset channel number location, tap the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4) to step through the preset locations (1 10).
- 4. To confirm the preset location, tap the STORE / ALARM BUTTON (#6).
- 5. To store up to 10 FM and 10AM station presets, repeat steps 1 to 4 above.

Recalling the Preset Radio Stations

- 1. Set the unit to Radio FM or AM mode.
- 2. Tap the TIME / MEM BUTTON (#2) repeatedly to select the desired preset station.

ALARM OPERATION

The unit has an alarm that will wake you up with a beeping sound.

The alarm beeper is built into the case so it is not necessary to connect earphones to hear the alarm.

- 1. In Power Off / Standby mode, press and hold the STORE / ALARM BUTTON (#6), the ALARM INDICATOR (#6) will turn on and the Hour digits of the alarm time will flash on the LCD display.
- 2. Tap the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4) until the correct hour is reached.
 - Note: Make sure the correct AM or PM time is selected when setting the hour.
- 3. Tap the STORE / ALARM BUTTON (#6) to confirm and the minute digits of alarm time will flash.
- 4. Tap the TUNER ▼ BUTTON (#3) / TUNER ▲ BUTTON (#4) until the correct minute is reached.
- 5. Tap the STORE / ALARM BUTTON (#6) to confirm and complete the alarm setting.
- 6. The Alarm will sound for 60 minutes at the time you entered.

TO STOP THE ALARM SOUND

When alarm sounds, press the STORE / ALARM BUTTON (#6) or the BAND / POWER O BUTTON (#5) once to stop the alarm and it will repeat next day same time

TO COMPLETELY TO TURN OFF ALARM (NOT RESET FOR NEXT DAY)
In standby mode, tap the STORE / ALARM BUTTON (#6) repeatedly until the ALARM INDICATOR (#20) disappears.

LOCK FUNCTION

To prevent accidental function changes during active use, this unit is fitted with a function lock button. After the unit has been powered on and the required station tuned, tap the LOCK BUTTON (#7) to lock all functions. The LOCK INDICATOR (#23) will show on the display.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- 1. Clean your unit with a damp (never wet) cloth. Solvent or detergent should never be used.
- 2. Avoid leaving your unit in direct sunlight or in hot, humid, or dusty places.
- 3. Keep your unit away from heating appliances and sources of electrical noise such as fluorescent lamps or motors.

CAUTION: Never allow any water or other liquids to get inside the unit while cleaning.
